Lesson Text: John 7:19-27.

I. To Judge Or Not To Judge?

- Some Religious People Say Making Any Kind Of Judgments Are Excluded.
 - Some Will Use Scripture Out Of Context:
 - Matthew 7:1-2; 1 Corinthians 4:5; James 4:12.
- But The Bible Says There Are Times We Must Make Judgments.
 - Between Matters Of Right & Wrong- 1 Corinthians 6:1-8.
 - Between Truth & Error- 1 John 4:1; 2 Timothy 2:16-18.
 - Between Who Is In Fellowship With God- Acts 9:26-27; Acts 16:15; Romans 16:17-18.

II. Making Righteous Judgments Demands:

- 1. That We Be Righteous In Our Motive.
 - Must Be Like Jesus- John 5:30.
 - Motives Can Be Very Wrong- Matthew 6:2, 5 & 16; Philippians 1:15-18;
 - If Our Motives Are Not Right Or Untainted From Retaliation Or Bitterness, Will God Approve Of Such Motivations? **Hebrews 4:12-13.**

2. That We Use The Righteous Standard.

- John 12:48.
- We Will Not Be Judged By Nor Judge Others By:
 - 1. Traditions Of Men. Matthew 15:1-2.
 - 2. The Law Of Moses. Colossians 2:14-17.
 - 3. The Writings And Creeds Of Men. Matthew 21:24-25; 1 Peter 4:11.

3. That We Do Not Judge By Appearance.

- John 7:24.
- We May Arrive At The Wrong Conclusion: John 1:46; John 7:52; & 8:41.

4. That We Use Judgment With Mercy.

- Contrary To The Opinion Of The World, Christians Are Not All About Condemning.
- Micah 6:8; Matthew 5:7; James 2:13.
- Mercy In Judgment Applied: 1 Corinthians 5:12-13; 2 Thessalonians 3:15. 2 Corinthians 2:6-8; Romans 2:4; Titus 1:11-13.

5. That We Be Consistent In Our Judgments.

- All Sin Is Wrong- Matthew 7:1-5.
- No Matter Who Does It- Proverbs 18:5.
