Lesson Text: Ephesians 4:17-21.

I. What Is Ignorance? And How Does It Happen?

- Ignorance is defined as: a lack of knowledge or information.
- The Two Types Of Ignorance: 1. Simple Ignorance 2. Self-Imposed Ignorance.
- How Ignorance Happens:
 - Indifference: We Don't Know, And We Don't Care That We Don't Know.
 - **Misinformation:** We Don't Know, By Being Taught Wrong Information.
 - Fear: We Don't Know, And We're Afraid To Find Out.
 - **Distractions:** We Don't Know, Because We're Too busy With Other Things.
 - Lack Of Information: We Don't Know, We've Never Been Taught God's Way.

II. How Ignorance Can Be A Tragedy?

- Because Of Ignorance:
 - Many Are Alienated From God. Romans 1:21-32; Ephesians 4:18.
 - The Jews Crucified Jesus. Luke 23:34; Acts 3:13-17; 1 Corinthians 2:7-8.
 - Many Have Misguided Zeal. Romans 10:1-3; 1 Timothy 1:12-15.
 - Many Have Embraced False Teaching. Matthew 22:23-29;
 2 Timothy 2:15-18; 1 Thessalonians 4:13; 1 Timothy 6:3-5.
 - Many Will Be Lost. 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9; 1 Timothy 2:3-4.
