"Congregational Unity"

Unity is something most people desire. We want to be with others or, more precisely, we want others to be with us. When others agree with us, believe like we do and do what we do, it gives a measure of comfort and security.

God made us social; He gave us a desire to be associated with others. He brings His children together in congregations and commands us to be united as His people. Paul wrote the church at Corinth and said, "Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment." (1 Corinthians 1:10).

This unity is not automatic. It requires diligent effort on our part. Thankfully, we see in God's word the way we can be united.

Unity Is Founded On God's Word

Jesus prayed for unity (John 17:17-23). He prayed that the apostles and all who believe in Him through their word would be "one." Notice that through the teaching of the word, the truth, people can be united.

The realization of Jesus' prayer is found in Acts 2. The apostles taught the gospel, the truth, and about 3,000 people were sanctified on that Pentecost (Acts 2:14-41). This new congregation of God's people at Jerusalem was united. The people worshipped together, ate meals with one another, and shared provisions with each other (Acts 2:42-46). This unity continued for some time, anchored in their shared love and commitment to truth (Acts 4:23-31; 5:42; cf. Acts 4:32-37).

Threats To Unity

Persecution is a serious threat. The arrest and abuse of the apostles could easily have led to Christians turning against one another (Acts 4, 5). However, they maintained their faith and trusted in God.

Sin within the church undermines unity. Ananias and Sapphira's sin not only separated them from God, but also endangered the harmony of the church (Acts 5:1-11). If the sin went unchecked, other sins might have been tolerated (cf. 1 Cor. 5:1-7). Thus, the sin was removed and the congregation remained intact.

The mistreatment of brethren drives wedges in a church. The Jerusalem brethren had a problem when some of the widows were neglected (Acts 6:1-6). Instead of ignoring the issue, it was addressed with the result of an even stronger bond among the saints. It allowed them to press on in the work of converting the lost (Acts 6:7).

Another threat to congregational unity is false doctrine. Some brethren were pushing the doctrine of the circumcision (Acts 15). With some accepting and others rejecting this teaching, division was growing. To stop this rift, the brethren assembled and debated the issue (Acts 15:4-21). In this debate truth triumphed over error. The saints at Jerusalem, as well as Antioch and other places were encouraged and united as a result (Acts 15:30-32; 16:4, 5).

Unity Leads To Growth

The devil uses division to hinder the cause of Christ. Jesus stated that the oneness of the disciples would help lead people to believe (Jn. 17:21). The opposite is true too.

If God's people are divided, it will drive the world to unbelief.

As the Christians in Jerusalem stood together, the church grew.

- o 3,000 5,000 (Acts 2:38-47; 4:4).
- o Believers increasingly added to the Lord (Acts 5:14).
- o Number of disciples multiplied (Acts 6:7).
- o Increased in number daily (Acts 16:5).

Harmony among brethren is crucial to the advancement of the cause of Christ. Peace is not to be had at the expense of truth. Rather, peace through truth leads to growth; saints will be edified while the lost are taught.

Each of us must do our part to ensure the unity of the congregation.

- o Stand in truth.
- o Do not waver in persecution.
- o Remove sin from your life & support its removal from the church.
- o Love the brethren.
- o Reject and resist doctrinal error.

In doing these things we will help our congregation fulfill the Lord's prayer that we all may be one.

"The Epidemic Of Fatherless Homes"

Lesson Text: Deuteronomy 22:22-24a.

I. The Problem Of Fathers Who Leave.

- This Is A Major Attack By Satan To Destroy The Home! 1 Peter 5:8; John 10:10.
 - Satan Works Through Temptations And Evil Desires... 1 John 2:15-17; James 1:14-15.
- Has Satan Done A Good Job In This Attack?
 - An estimated 24.7 million children (33%) live absent their biological father.
 - Of students in grades 1 through 12, 39 percent (17.7 million) live in homes absent their biological fathers.
 - 57.6% of black children, 31.2% of Hispanic children, and 20.7% of white children are living absent their biological fathers.
 - According to 72.2 % of the U.S. population, fatherlessness is the most significant family or social problem facing America.
- President Obama Even Addressed This Among Men in 2009.
- This Causes Severe Damage To The Home As God Designed It!

II. Why Do Fathers Leave?

- They Are Only Interested In Fulfilling Their Own Selfish Desires- **Ephesians 2:3.**
- They Don't Want Any Responsibilities, Commitment, Or Burdens In The Home.
- They Want Freedom To Do As They Please, Without Any Restrictions.
- They Leave To Go Looking For "Greener Pastures." 2 Timothy 3:1-4.
- They Are Incarcerated And Are Away In Prison.
- They May Even Be Forced To Leave Because Of Abuse.
- They Are Tempted By The Tempter To Leave Sin! I Timothy 5:8. What Other Sins?
